CCL—Citizens' Climate Lobby, speaker Julie Nowak

The Whidbey Citizens' Climate Lobby chapter supports the work of Citizens' Climate Lobby (CCL) to get Whidbey residents working together to motivate our representative and two senators to the US Congress to take action to address the national and global climate crisis. CCL is a nonprofit, nonpartisan, grassroots advocacy climate change organization.

How is it threatened by the chaos at the federal government level?

Voters are discouraged, distracted.

CCL values bipartisan solutions because they are usually more durable.

Congress is being pressured to retreat to their respective corners, making it more challenging to secure two key climate efforts:

- The climate-related programs created by the Inflation Reduction Act which CCL lobbied hard to get passed! are at risk.
- Clean energy permitting reform

What are the threats to your organization's work in the current political climate nationally?

While we do not rely directly on federal funds, we do have some county and foundation grants that may be affected indirectly by federal funding cuts. And eventually all of us non profits will be competing for the same donor population. Also, if Social Security and Medicare are disrupted, we will see a huge increased need from our members.

What actions are you taking to combat those threats?

We are actively reaching out to other community leaders on the island to see where we can collaborate, identify gaps, and redundancies.

How can people assist your organization in a meaningful way?

What are the threats to your organization's work in the current political climate nationally? Food access programs such as Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and the WIC and Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Programs (FMNP)

What actions are you taking to combat those threats? We lobbied the state legislature and national congress people to maintain food access programs as well as policies for regenerative and organic agriculture standards.

Whidbey Camano Land Trust

We are a nationally accredited nonprofit that works to protect, restore, and appreciate the natural diversity and beauty of Whidbey and Camano Islands.

What are the threats to your organization's work in the current political climate nationally? There is a threat to historically bi-partisan funding sources that have helped support our work.

- Possibility of reduced grant funding on the federal level
- Possible removal of previous environmental protections at the regulatory level
- Possibility of less support for protection/restoration work

What actions are you taking to counter those threats? Continue to diversify our funding sources including local and state agencies and private foundations. Using new conservation tools to make projects. Talking to our elected, prioritizing projects that don't require federal funding.

How can people assist your organization in a meaningful way? Continue to support the Land Trust with unrestricted financial donations as well as volunteer at work parties or outreach program. Sign up for our monthly eNews to stay up-to-date with our projects.

What are the threats to your organization's work in the current political climate nationally? We are concerned about federal and state grants, but locally we feel that this initiative is well received and will move forward.

What actions are you taking to combat those threats? We are volunteering a lot of our time and getting the community engaged so that we can build this locally.

What are the threats to your organization's work in the current political climate nationally?

Approximately \$500k in frozen federal funds for research, education, and technical assistance which is at risk of being cancelled and is disrupting our regularly occurring programs.

What actions are you taking to combat those threats?

Seeking to diversify our funding and keeping abreast of local and federal developments.

Whidbey Island Grown Cooperative

Whidbey Island Grown Cooperative (WIGC) is a collaboration of 79 Whidbey Island farmers, food producers, businesses, non-profits, and community members.

What are the threats to your organization's work in the current political climate nationally? WIGC has multiple federal grants that are currently affected by the federal grant funding freeze. In addition to current grants held, there is no guarantee that USDA grant programs will continue.

Our Whidbey farmers are and will be affected by reductions in USDA grant programs. Agriculture production and food systems infrastructure on our rural island are already trending heavily downward, and increasing our local food supply will become even more difficult.

What actions are you taking to combat those threats?

I see WIGC and our local food hub partners across the state and region as essential in the new economy and country that's being created right now.

How can people assist your organization in a meaningful way?

The biggest thing our community can do right now to help our local food system is to **choose local food** producers as much as possible.
