

Previously in Whatcom, Skagit counties








HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE ON WHIDBEY AND FIDALGO










TWO LOCAL FIRES- CASE STUDY

- LITTLE CRABERRY
- 2016
- Around 20 acres
- Neighborhood in WUI threatened
- Believed to be caused by smoking materials

- THOMAS LANE FIRE
- 2018
- Around 10 acres
- Neighborhood in WUI threatened
- Unattended fire left by transient camper






LITTLE CRANBERRY LAKE FIRE ACFL 2016

ASSISTANT CHIEF JACK KENNEDY-

• "I've been with the department for **34 years**, and it's the largest wildland (fire) we've had. We've had several acres in size but not like this. **The fire behavior that we experienced up here was also not normal for this area.** We had trees that were actually torching from the bottom to the top because of the relative humidity temperature and also the slope of the hill the fire was actually on."






LOCAL FIREFIGHTERS -FIRELINE

SWFE

We serve people on Whidbey Island South of Mutiny Bay Road. We serve approximately 15,000 residents, 10,000 visitors and 533 businesses over 66 square miles.

We rely on full-time and volunteer emergency personnel who respond to an average of 2,600 calls a year.
